## Philanthropy Committee Update By Jenny Stephens

The statistics are heart breaking which could be the reason our focus on Philanthropy this month is Harbor House. In the month of February, **Catholic Charities** will be receiving the EWI of Wichita's generosity in their mission towards domestic

Since 1992 Catholic Charities Harbor House has provided shelter, outreach, support and compassion to victims of family violence. The shelter is staffed 24 hours per day, seven days a week with caring trained people who meet the emotional needs of women and children in crisis.

Did you know according to the 2011 statistics:

- 24% of all homicides were the result of domestic violence
- 1 domestic violence murder every 13 days
- 1 domestic violence incident every 21 minutes 48 seconds

The staff at Harbor House is focused on the safety and shelter for the women and children they serve. They are able to provide private rooms and connect the mothers to the vital necessities of job training, medical care and day care. In addition, these life changing events require the emotional support of the staff's counseling, educational and children's programs. These support programs become essential in realizing a life free from abuse so victims are able to envision a future filled with promise and hope.

This shelter exists to help break the cycle of violence against women and their children by providing them a safe place to stay.

She wants to include the blessings received from being patient, which isn't always easy and putting her trust in God, allowing her to come full circle. She is now experiencing a wonderful, much deserved second chance at a happy life.
