There will be another great opportunity at our April 19 meeting. We get the privilege of touring the new Experiential Engineering Building (EEB) at WSU. We will hear from John Tomblin, VP for

Research & Technology Transfer & Executive Director for NIAR and then tour the facility on our own with WSU personnel/students available at each point of reference to demonstrate the equipment and answer any questions. We will tour the Go Create makerspace that is filled with machines that will cut and shape metal, wood, plastics and foam. 


